LADIES CLUB INFORMATION

ETIQUETTE

In the interest of all, players should play without delay. No player should play until the players in front are out of range. Players searching for a ball should signal the players behind them to pass as soon as it becomes clear that the ball will not be easily found; they should not search for five minutes before doing so. They should not continue to play until the players following them have passed and are out of range. When the play of a hole has been completed, players should immediately leave the putting green. No-one should move, talk or stand close to or directly behind the ball or the hole when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke. Before leaving a bunker, a player should carefully fill up and smooth over all holes and footprints made by him. Through the fairway, a player should ensure that any turf cut or displaced, is replaced at once and pressed down and all pitch marks made to the putting green by the ball are repaired.

SLOW PLAY

Help to avoid slow play in 2007 - Causes and Cures

Cause: Leaving clubs and trolleys at the front of the green. By doing this, you have to walk all the way back from the hole towards those waiting to play.

Cure: Leave bags and trolleys in a line between the flag and the next tee, so you don't have to retrace your steps.

Cause: Many Players unwittingly add time to a round by waiting for a partner to play a shot before walking to their own ball and making the decision on what club to play.

Cure: If it is safe to do so, get to your ball as soon as possible so you are ready when it is your turn.

Cause: The rules allow you five minutes to search for a ball before it has to be declared lost.

Cure: Call players through as soon as it is obvious that a search is needed to find a ball. This avoids too much delay.

Cause: One or two practice swings to get the feel of the shot to be played, are perfectly acceptable, but some players make a half-a-dozen before they actually set-up and hit the ball.

Cure: More than two practice swings means you are wasting everyone's time, including your own. After all, you want to leave your best swing for the real thing.

Cause: Marking your card on the green when people are waiting to play up is a golfing crime and is unforgivable.

Cure: Get well clear of the green before you do the paperwork.

Whichever player has the honor should drive off immediately and then mark card while others are driving.

Cause: It is one thing to do your homework on the green but it is another to hold everyone up for an unacceptable long period. There is nothing worse than watching players

taking a painfully long time over a short putt and then miss it.

Cure: Be considerate to others by not taking too long weighing up your putts.

Competition Rules

Canceling

In all circumstances, notify playing partners

Erase name from Timesheet, which is displayed in office, as early as possible.

If canceling on day of competition, notify the pro-shop

Before Play

Enter name in Computer by using card

Enter Competition Book

Pay Entry Fee

Enter name, date & handicap on scorecard

After Play

Cards must be checked and signed by marker and player

Cards must be placed in Ladies Competition Box

Both completed cards and "No returns" must be entered in computer for all 18 Hole Singles competitions

Failure to comply with rules 1 & 2 above can result in disqualification

Ties

Where there is a tie, the following applies:

Stableford & Par

18 Holes - last 9, 6, 3, 2, 1 and then 3, 6, 7, 8, of the first 9 Holes

12 Holes - last 6, 3, 2, 1, 5, 4, 9, 8, 7, 11, 10.

9 Holes - last 6, 3, 2, 1, 5, 4, 8, 7.

Strokes

Add last 9 - Deduct half of handicap

Add last 6 - Deduct 3rd of handicap

Add last 3 - Deduct 6th of handicap

Special Prizes

GOLFER OF THE YEAR

Is awarded to the player who accumulates the most points overall in 18 holes singles qualifying competitions. In the event of a tie, there will be a playoff over 18 holes stroke. Points are awarded as follows:

1st = 10 2nd = 9 3rd = 8 4th = 7 5th = 6

6th = 5 7th = 4 8th = 3 9th = 2 10th = 1

ILGU PRIZES

Silver Spoon - is awarded to the player who returns the lowest aggregate of three nett stroke scores in qualifying singles competition over the year. Only one score counts in each month.

ILGU Pennant - is awarded to the winner of the September Medal

Silver Medal - is awarded to the player who returns the lowest aggregate of best four net strokes scores in qualifying singles competition (handicap under 21)

Bronze Medal - is awarded to the players who returns the lowest aggregate of best four net strokes scores in qualifying singles competition (handicap 21-36)

Handicap Allowances (CONGU Rules)

Matchplay

Singles: FULL difference between the handicaps of the players

Foursomes: 1 / 2 of the difference in combined handicap of each side

Fourball: Lowest handicap concedes strokes to other three players on 3 / 4 of the difference between the full handicaps. In all matches, the lowest handicap player reverts to scratch.
